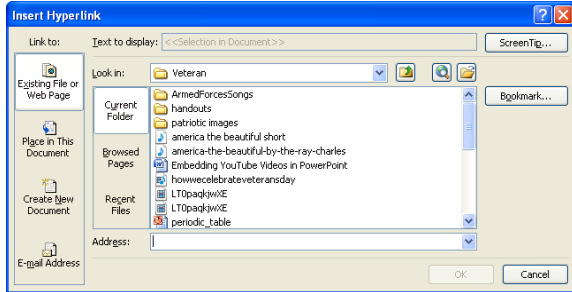


# Working with Video in PowerPoint – the other way

## Link to the file

1. **Save the video in the same folder as your PowerPoint.**
2. View the appropriate slide in *Normal* view
3. Insert some text or an image to use as a link that you will click to open the video.
4. RIGHT-click the text or image.
5. Click **Hyperlink**.
6. Click Existing File or Web Page, then Current Folder, and choose the video.



7. Click OK.

These are “work arounds” to use if PowerPoint doesn’t recognize the video file format.

Various organizations offer “Add-ins” that can be installed on home computers to add other types of video. (Most are not free.)

## Embedding a YouTube Movie

1. Get the Developer Tab.
  - a. Click the Office Button.
  - b. Click PowerPoint Options. (At the bottom of the window)
  - c. Click Show Developer tab in the ribbon.
2. Add a Shockwave Object.
  - a. Click the More Controls button.
  - b. Choose Shockwave Flash Object and click OK
  - c. Hold down and drag to draw a rectangle object on the slide.
3. Set the object Properties.
  - a. RIGHT-click the rectangle.
  - b. Choose Properties.
  - c. Change Embed Movie to True.
  - d. Paste the YouTube URL into the Movie field.
  - e. In the URL, delete watch? Then change the = to /
  - f. Close the Properties box.
4. Save the file and view the Slideshow.  
(You have to have Internet access for it to work.)
