We also have important events this spring that include STAAR testing (last week of March for English STARR and TELPAS; first week of May for Science, Math, and History STAAR) and our final commencement exercise at UNT May 31st.

There are a few tips for parents to help relieve the stress and anxiety many students experience during testing season. 1) Encourage your child by helping to develop a "you got this" frame of mind. 2) Have your child practice released STAAR test questions located on TEA's website. 3) Make sure your child is organized, fed, and prepared on test day. Lastly, consider offering a reward the same week of the test as a motivator.

Potential graduates and their parents have been notified of upcoming dates, fees, and requirements for the Spring commencement. All candidates for graduation must submit final assignments to their teachers by Friday, May 19th; however, we are instilling the importance of being early, not last minute. The May 19th deadline includes having credit recovery or "seat time" completed (\$50 fee), passing all STAAR assessments, and meeting district credit requirements.

Fred Moore High School staff is collaborating with community partners such as TWU mentors, NCTC Project Achieve, and Denton ISD affiliates to insure the success of every child. We invite other agencies and organizations to be an active part of our team as well. I hope to cultivate and grow Fred Moore's culture and climate through positive, thriving relationships with all our stakeholders.

Interact Club is sponsored by Rotary Club International. Part of that sponsorship requires Interact to adopt an international project each year. This year our project is ShelterBox, which was started by a Rotary Club in England.

ShelterBox is an international disaster relief charity that provides temporary shelter and life saving supplies to families that have been displaced by a disaster. Each ShelterBox costs about \$1000 and typically comes with a tent designed to withstand extreme weather, a water purification kit, blankets, tools, and other necessities. ShelterBox response teams will personally deliver the boxes and show the recipients how to set it up and give each family a contract that legally gives the ShelterBox to them.

Interact Club did two fundraisers for this project. In February, we sponsored a Valentine's Day bake sale and in March we had Penny Wars (Girls vs. Boys). Our students and faculty of FMHS along with the personnel of SPED and Adult Ed. raised \$120.03 for ShelterBox during the Penny Wars. Both fundraisers brought in a total of \$237.03. The Morning Rotary Club of Denton will match the funds raised for ShelterBox.

Don't Be Fooled - You'll be surprised how many questions you're capable of missing just by misreading a thing or two. For example, if a question asks for a certain number of fruits, don't choose an answer choice that mentions vegetables. Take some time to re-read questions and answer choices.

Don't Rush - When you're skimming through a test, it's really easy to make silly mistakes that will cost you

points. Make sure you understand what the question is really asking for. Sometimes, especially in math-related questions, a question may ask for an answer in miles but will have answer choices using feet.
