About Enhanced Courses						
Enhanced classes will require more time than a regular class and the workload will be increased. In an enhanced class you can expect to do more intensive reading, more projects, and be challenged on a higher thinking level. Enhanced classes will require regular reading assignments, essay writing, in-class discussions, and working with primary source materials. They will require projects and research that are more intensive than the regular class. The ability to take and organize notes is essential to enhanced classes.						
About Pre-AP Courses						
Pre-AP (Advanced Placement) courses are taught using advanced materials and strategies. Because of the intensity of Pre-AP courses, students should expect the pace and academic rigor to be above grade level to prepare students for high school Pre-AP and Advanced Placement courses. College Board Advanced Placement Courses provide college level studies for high school students who desire and are ready to do college level work. In other words, these students have a strong curiosity about the subject and a willingness to work hard.						
Typically, successful AP and Pre-AP students are task-oriented, proficient readers who are able to organize their time and who have parental/guardian support. Students who are already overextended with academics or extracurricular activities should seriously consider whether they have the time to devote to AP/Pre-AP classes. Outside study time is at least one to two times the amount of time spent in class per week.						
Before registering for an Enhanced or Pre-AP class, please be sure you and your parents fully understand the expectations required of students taking such classes.

A meeting with parent/guardian, teacher, counselor and administrator and the student must take place and will determine on a case-by-case basis whether a course change is in the best interest of the student. In the event of a transfer, it is possible that a schedule change may affect numerous courses.
