#### **BOOK REVIEW**

"Wild Awake" by Hilary T. Smith, Katherine Tegan Books, 2013

Kiri, a 17-year-old classically trained pianist, has the house to herself while her parents take their dream vacation. She is supposed to practice her piano daily to get ready for a big recital. But when she gets a strange phone call from a man claiming to have her dead sister's belongings, Kiri puts the practicing on hold to find the truth. Kiri soon uncovers a big family secret – that her sister was murdered rather than dying in a car accident – and begins a spiral into a deep depression. In Skunk, who is a bit strange himself, Kiri finds a kindred soul who helps her find the truth about her sister and herself. Their friendship leads them to a love which helps Kiri face her newfound reality as well as her disappointment in her parents for keeping the truth from her. Teen girls will like the romance and how Kiri deals with the pressure of finding out all kinds of truths about her family.

When was the site created?
When was the site last updated?
WHERE

Where does the information come from?

**WHY** 

Why is this information useful for my purpose?
Why should I use this information?
Why is this page better than another?

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
