Before you use that website in your research...



EAD THE URL

- Look for the owning entity (person, company, or organization) in the website address (URL). Are they an authority on the subject?
- Identify the URL extension:

gov = government com = commercial or business mil = military

edu = education org = any organization net = any organization

EXAMINE THE CONTENT!

- Based on what you already know about your topic, is the information on the website useful & accurate?
- Are additional links and resources provided?
- Is the site current and updated? (look for a date, often at the bottom of the webpage)

SK ABOUT THE AUTHOR OR OWNER.

 Sometimes the author is hard to find. Look for clues in the URL, on "About" pages within the site, or use <u>easyWhois.com</u> to find clues as to the author.

OOK AT THE LINKS.

- Look at links to other websites. Are the linked websites credible?
- Use altavista.com to look for "back" links by typing link:http://theurlyouwanttocheck.com
