How shall I ever forget that dreadful vigil? For half an hour I sat with straining ears. Then suddenly another sound became **audible**—a very gentle, soothing sound, like that of a small **jet** of steam escaping **continually** from a kettle. The instant that we heard it, Holmes sprang from the bed, struck a match, and lashed furiously with his cane at the bell-pull.

"You see it, Watson?" he yelled. "You see it?"
But I saw nothing. At the moment when
Holmes struck the light I heard a low, clear
whistle, but the sudden **glare** flashing into my
weary eyes made it impossible for me to tell
what it was at which my friend lashed so
savagely. I could, however, see that his face
was deadly pale, and filled with horror and
loathing.
