## What is an Occupational Therapist?

An occupational therapist is a professional who works with individuals of all ages to increase their independence with functional and preferred activities. They can be found in school systems, hospitals, rehab hospitals, community outpatient centers, mental health facilities, homes, and many other places. Occupational thera-

pists are unique because they look at the patient or individual as a whole and can be a vital part of any individual's plan of care.

In the school system, occupational therapists work with students who are in special education to access the school environment. This could include physical places within the building or finding

a different way to access the curriculum.

## How are therapy services in school different than a hospital or private clinic?

Occupational therapists have 2 primary models to base service delivery on: medical model and educational model.

Medically related services are generally performed to change the child's physical status. Treatment objectives are generally chosen along a predetermined developmental/physical change or rehabilitative sequence, regardless of the amount of time re-

quired to achieve the targeted goal.

Educational therapy services, including techniques chosen, are designed to meet the student's educational goals, as determined at an IEP meeting. At times, adaptations and/or modification and/or consultation with the teacher may be the only intervention(s) necessary to help the child succeed in the classroom.

A child can receive direct or consultative services. Direct services are direct contact with a student or within a small group of students. Consultative services are services to the teachers, classroom staff, and the student to meet the student's goals and objectives.
