Curiosity

This month our students have been learning about the habitude of curiosity. The definition that we have used is: curiosity is a mindset that enables individuals to explore their internal and external worlds by asking questions, seeking answers, and engaging in a wide range of personal and interpersonal activities. The students have done several activities to explore their curiosity and are being encourage to ask "how" and "why" questions. For example, lots of people saw apples fall, but only Sir Isaac Newton dared to ask why or how. Questions are a powerful tool to help us make decisions, solve problems, invent, change, and improve our lives and the lives of others around us. As parents, it can become challenging when our children continue to ask us "why" and sound like a broken record. Please know that these questions are important. Questions, not answers, define our students as learners. Celebrate when your children ask Why is the sky blue? What happens if...? Let them know that their questions matter. Some of the smartest people and change makers become who they are by asking questions.

New Recycling Program in the Cafeteria

On October 15, 2015, Woodrow Wilson became the first elementary school to begin the Milk Carton Recycling Program in Denton. In this program, students are encouraged to help make our environment more sustainable by recycling the milk cartons that we would normally throw away.
