

#### What you need to know about Lice

Many people believe that head lice can fly or jump, but head lice never have wings and they are unable to jump.

You can use a medicated shampoo, cream rinse, or lotion to kill the lice. These may be over-the-counter (OTC) or prescription medications. Medicated lice treatments usually kill the lice and nits, but it may take a few days for the itching to stop. We also recommend repeating treatment in 7 to 10 days to kill any newly hatched nits.

Wash all bed linens, clothing, and toys that's been recently worn or played by anyone in your home who's infested in Very hot water.

Soak hair-care items like combs, barrettes, hair ties or bands, headbands, and brushes in rubbing alcohol or medicated shampoo for 1 hour. You also can wash them in hot water or just throw them away.
