So when I do ask for help please know that I really need it. I will need parents to volunteer to help with costumes, sets, and tournament transportation. I will be better at asking for help this year because I believe that you and your skills can improve the quality of the work we do. If you have the skills, we have the tasks! SMS Theatre Department 2011-2012 Fees and Notices

<u>Production Fee</u>: \$20 per show (which includes a script and a show shirt)

Tournament Entry Fees: \$10 per tournament to help offset entries fees

Tournament Drop Fees: \$5-\$25 depending on the Tournament Host

Tournament Squad: \$10 (includes tournament binder, and slicks)

<u>Thespian Banquet</u>: \$10 per person (includes meal and fabulous awards ceremony)

Only Thespians and family members of Thespians are invited.

Department & Show Shirts: \$10-\$12 for dept. shirt or extra show shirts

All students involved in Theatre Arts productions, tournaments, and events MUST maintain a passing grade in all classes to remain eligible for competition.

Performance Etiquette Note:

All students involved in a performance are required to be at call $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours before curtain to get in costume & make-up. In order for our cast & crew to be physically and mentally focused for the performance, we ask that parents refrain from visiting their children backstage or in the Theatre room before the show. Students will be expected to be in the theatre room and not running in the hallways before the show starts. I've been a little more lineate with this in the past but plan to change that this year. All actors can visit family and friends after the show and students will need to have eaten before they come to get dressed.

SMS Theatre Activities & Events

Tournament Squad

Strickland Middle School Theatre is going to compete in team tournament style contests in Duet Acting, DI (Dramatic Interpretation), HI (Humorous Interpretation), Prose, Poetry, Storytelling, Pantomime, TV Commercial, Lip Sync, Vocal, and Poster Design throughout the school year. These tournaments are always held on Saturdays and students usually travel by district transportation (The Yellow Dog) school bus. In order to offset cost to the department, occasionally we will travel with another Denton middle school. Support is appreciated in the way of snacks, send-offs, good luck wishes, and attendance in our tournament showcase held at Strickland Middle School.

Due to the elimination of Advisory, Practices for the Tournament Squad will be held after school and tournaments are to be announced. At this time I am aware of 2 tournaments for Denton ISD, one in the fall and another in the spring. It's our goal to attend both.

Plays

SMS Theatre produces several productions each school year with the intent of providing optimum opportunities for actors and technicians to master the craft in various genres of Theatre. Support is sought for virtually every aspect of the production process including costumes, props, set building, snacks, and front of house.

Play rehearsal: students are expected to be in the auditorium by 3:45 helping to set up the stage, rehearsal will be done by 6:15. *Please Please Please* pick your student up on-time. I will do my best to make sure the rehearsal is done on time and am asking that you will do the same.

One Act Festival

One Act Play Contest provides an opportunity for our middle school students to compete against other area middle schools and receive a critique from a judge. Auditions for OAP are very competitive and numbers for cast and crew are limited due to the rules of the contest. SMS has received countless individual acting and technical awards from past contests as well as Superior Ratings for many years. This is a unique experience for our highly dedicated young thespians to prepare for high school UIL OAP.

This year's OAP contest is February 2, 2011 from 9am - 6pm, parent and student supporters are welcomed to attend. Students will be informed on what time to be there when we're told what performance slot we get. The dress code is always the show shirt and jeans. No pajama pants or sloppy clothes. School dress code applies.

UIL Prose/Poetry

SMS Theatre students have the opportunity to be selected for UIL competition in Prose and Poetry interpretation. UIL has many other events in which our SMS students may participate. Be advised that students are limited to three UIL competition events.

Class Play Requirements

All Full Year and some semester classes do a class play.

These plays are the student's final grade - and it's a huge one. There will be a day time performance during their period, followed by an after school performance that same day. Students must be at both. Due to the fact that class plays don't allow for understudies all class members are extremely important and need to be there the night of their performance.

PLEASE COME TO YOUR STUDENT'S CLASS PLAY PERFORMANCE IN THE EVENING.

You can come during the day also but we do the evening performance specifically for you. This is one of the only play productions we don't charge admission!!! Please support your student in their final performance.

"These are extensions of classroom activities that relate directly to the essential elements through participation, demonstrate, illustration, and observation. Certain state-approved courses require performance before an audience as part of the instructional process. This includes courses such as theatre arts, band, orchestra, choir, and athletics. These activities are considered in the students' grade."

Friday Nite Live (takes place in April)

This is our version of Saturday Night Live. Students perform short skits recreated from SNL or Mad TV or have the opportunity to come up with their own. Students can also record commercials to be played during our live performances.

Mock Rock

New this year, we're going to try out a new event.... MOCK ROCK... our first Lip Sync contest. Students will be judged on performance, costume and creativity. Lip Sync is always a very popular unit in class so this year I've decided to take it to the next level and make a school wide event. More details will be coming soon.

Thespian Meetings

One Friday of the month students are invited to attend our Thespian meetings. We usually do some theatre activities or work on something that needs to be done for upcoming shows.

If you want to become a member or stay an active member it is important that you come to the meetings. Active members need to earn at least 7 points to stay an active member. If you want to be an officer it is important that you first become a Thespian.

To become a member you have to have earned 10 points thru-out the year. You earn points by being in plays, helping with plays, coming to meetings, going to tournament, seeing plays etc. We keep track of all the Thespian points at the meetings.

At the end of the year we will have our Thespian Banquet to honor all the new inductees as well as the ones that stayed involved with Theatre during the year. After we eat and have our awards ceremony the kids stay until 12 am for the after party - planned by the Thespian Officers.

SMS Theatre Student Expectations

Members of the SMS Theatre Department are expected to behave in an exemplary manner, both on campus and when traveling. Your behavior reflects not only upon you, but our Theatre department, Strickland Middle School, and Denton ISD.

Classroom Etiquette

Failure to adhere to the classroom guidelines <u>will affect your class grade</u>, and lead to disciplinary action.

Be on Time with your supplies -this means in your seat ready to start class when the tardy bell rings. Not dilly dallying around visiting and taking your time getting your journal and eventually walking to your seat.

Never Talk or Disrupt During Any Presentation Be Respectful of Others & their Property Don't Disturb Others While They Are Working Stay on Task & Use Your Time Wisely No Personal Hygiene During Class

Due on assigned date - late work will be 20 points off.

It is extremely important for you to be in class. Most of what we do is an in class activity that cannot be made up. Please ask parents to schedule appointments for another time. Especially when you're working with a group, the group tends to work so much better with all members present.

Dismissal:

- And she does so when the room is cleaned up and all chairs are pushed in.

Teamwork:

It is very important to me that we all work as a team no matter what we're working on. From preparing for a performance to cleaning up the room the selfish mentality doesn't work with me. A helpful person is what I like to see.

AUDIENCE ETIQUETTE

proper and acceptable behavior of audience (class) members during a presentation/performance



As one performs, the actor deserves respect from all members of the audience. The young actor has a heavy burden. Questions in his mind and concerns constantly interfere with his performance. "Can I remember my lines? Everyone is looking at me. Are they talking about me? What did I do wrong? I feel sick! I'm not ready. Will I ever survive this?

Therefore, it's very important for the audience to quietly pay attention during each performance to show support for the student on stage.

The following are a few rules of audience etiquette that all will be expected to practice both during class as well as during a play performance in the auditorium or where ever we might be watching a play.

- 1. Pay attention to all performances; watch and listen.
- 2. Stay quiet; absolutely no talking.
- 3. Never make fun of another person's performance.
- 4. Refrain from shouting comments to or intentionally distracting the actor during his presentation.
- 5. Avoid practicing your scene during other performances.
- 6. Applaud every presentation.
- 7. Never get out of your seat, move around the room, sit restless at your seat, or distract the teacher during a performance.
- 8. The teacher-director is the one to offer suggestions or critiques after final performances. During the rehearsal process you will often provide peer evaluations to help enhance the final presentation. Please refrain from making negative remarks to your classmates after they have completed a final performance.
