Statement	1. Statements end with a period. This summer I saw The Color Purple at a theater in New York.
Question	2. Questions end with a question mark. What is your favorite color?
Exclamation	3. Sentences that show strong feelings end with an exclamation point. Look, the colors of that rainbow are so vivid!
Quotations	4. Periods and commas are always placed inside the quotation marks. "I'll take three gallons of yellow and one gallon of white," Jon told the clerk.
Quotations	5. Punctuation marks (other than periods and commas) are placed inside the quotation marks only if they are part of the quotation. The decorator wanted to know, "What colors do you not like?" How did you feel about his suggestion to use "only shades of green"?
Apostrophe	6. An apostrophe is used when letters in a word are left out. I don't care for lavender, and I can't stand bright reds.
Apostrophe	7. An apostrophe shows ownership/possession (except with pronouns). Isabella's dog has beautiful golden fur.
Comma	8. Use commas with a list of three or more words/phrases. The school walls have been repainted in shades of green, blue, and gray.
Comma	9. A comma separates the date and the year. No comma is needed for just the month and the year. Grandma has not painted her house since May 20, 1990. The painting will be completed by August 2008.
Comma	10. Use commas to separate the city/town from the state and to separate the state from the rest of the sentence. The school colors for Michigan State University in East Lansing, Michigan, are green and white.
Semicolon	11. Use a semicolon to separate two independent clauses—two complete thoughts. The boys want to paint the walls a light gray; the girls prefer peach.
Colon	12. Use a colon to introduce a list or to emphasize words, phrases, clauses, or sentences at the end of a statement.To complete the job we need six items: red paint, green paint, brushes, rollers, pans, tarps.I love two kinds of colors: strong primary colors and deep earth tones.
