



Brett will have the calendar with dates available for volunteers as well as background check forms to complete if you haven't yet done that. Please remember that district policy prevents you from volunteering with students without a completed background check and that these checks take approximately 2 weeks to complete and have results back to our campus.



"Where Children's Stories Come to Life"

What started as a gift from the PTA to E.P. Rayzor of 13 Nook Colors last summer has now become a total of 25 thanks to the technology department of DISD. The check was given to Dr. Carrico in August so that purchasing could occur through the proper channels within the district. When it reached the technology department for approval however, we hit a "speed bump". The district had been looking at e-readers as potential future technology already so the technology and legal departments within the district entered discussions and eventually contract negotiations with Barnes & Noble. By increasing the order to 25, we qualified for an education and bulk discount and the DISD paid for the additional e-readers. We all owe a big "Thank You" to Dr. Carrico, Ms. Carey and Beth Landers for their time and dedication to seeing this idea through to its full potential!

E.P. Rayzor is now considered to be a pilot program for Nook Colors in the DISD. We will be watched and supported by the district and Barnes & Noble to ensure this is a successful program. Ms. Carey will be developing measurement tools so that she can report back to the district on how they are used and their effectiveness. Teachers that utilize them for classroom learning will also provide feedback. IF we are successful, the District would like to eventually enter an agreement with Barnes & Noble to launch this program to other schools.

Ms. Carey received the Nooks and protective covers last week and is getting them ready for the students to use when they return in January. They will be divided into groups by grade level so that the content is easier to manage. These have the ability to read aloud to the kids in Kindergarten and 1st grade as they learn to read and have an installed dictionary for the older kids to tap on a word to look up its' meaning as they are reading. There are also educational apps that have been installed that teachers can use with the students to reinforce concepts being taught in class. Mrs. Vaughn, our Dyslexia Therapy teacher, is already making plans to use the Nooks in January with some of her students.

Nook Colors Continued...

The staff will be trained by reps from the Denton Barnes & Noble store in January. Those reps will be back out for at least one training sessions for the library volunteers later in January as well. If you volunteer in the library, look for an email with more information after the first of the year.

None of this would have been possible without <u>YOUR</u> support of EP Rayzor and the PTA. Thank you for allowing us to take the first step in making this a reality for our school!

Stay tuned...we'll ask Ms. Carey to provide an update in the spring as to how the kids are using the Nooks and what they are learning.


