#### **Volunteer Information**

Volunteering is an essential part of keeping our school functioning and we couldn't do it without the help of all our parents, grandparents, friends and neighbors. Last school year, we reported 19,533 volunteer hours which was 10% of the elementary volunteer hours for the district (23 schools)! This year, the district is hoping for an overall increase in hours of 5%. To keep in line with this, we're hoping to increase our number of hours to 20,510. So please remember to record all your volunteer time – at school or anywhere else.

**Thank you** to everyone who has already completed their Volunteer Enrollment Form & Background Check. We are anxious to get each of you into the school to help out in the specific areas you've requested. If you haven't completed the Volunteer Enrollment Form & Background Check, please pick one up in the front office or ask your child's teacher to send one home. The approval process can take up to two weeks. Please remember that these forms must be completed before you are able to help with field trips, 5<sup>th</sup> grade camp or any other volunteer activity at school. Once your background check has been approved by the District, you will begin receiving emails requesting your help AND you will notice that you can sign-in as a volunteer on the computer in the front office.

# **Reading Counts**

#### What is Reading Counts??

Our amazing reading incentive program, Reading Counts, kicks off at EP Rayzor on October 11<sup>th</sup>! As the chair of the Reading Counts committee for PTA this year it is my personal goal to increase the number of students who participate in this program and to see our students build a life-long love of reading. Here is how the program works:

Students in 1<sup>st</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade are encouraged to read for comprehension by taking quizzes about the books they have read. These quizzes are taken on school computers during school hours, at times approved and designated by their teachers. Students receive points for these quizzes and the points are totaled for each six week school period. Point goals vary by grade and increase throughout the year. The last six weeks is actually a combined total for year to date points.

Students who meet their goals for the current six week period will be recognized and receive a free book of their choice in our Reading Counts Bookstore. The Top 10 readers of each grade for each six week receive a  $2^{nd}$  free book as well as a certificate of accomplishment and an ice cream snack in our cafeteria! All students who reach their End of Year goals will have a special breakfast with the principals in the Wolf Den and the Top 10 readers of each grade for the End of Year receive a special award.

#### What books?

You can check the link under the Library page on the school website to browse books to see if a book qualifies for Reading Counts. Also, books checked out from the school library or most classroom books should have a sticker in the inside cover stating whether it is a Reading Counts book and how many points the quiz will yield.

#### When do they read them?

Anytime! These can be books they read in class, library books, homework reading, or books read at home for fun.

#### How do we know how many points they have?

Students have access to the computers at school to check their points and are able to take quizzes until 2:50 pm on the last day of the six week period. Reports are run after that time.

#### What is the key to success?

Motivation!! We have seen that students who are motivated by their parents and teachers to participate in Reading Counts become attuned to looking for books that qualify and spending 'free time' in class reading, taking quizzes and building their reading comprehension. We are also implementing a GREAT school-wide reading goal so **every** reader knows that every point counts!! Stay tuned for more details!

Be on the lookout for the Reading Counts Pledge for you and your student to sign at Teacher Conferences so that they are ready to hit the ground running on October 11<sup>th</sup>!!

This is the name of the new **PRIVATE** and **SECURE** database system we are using through our affiliation with National PTA. The National PTA endorses this particular system because of its privacy and security features and the fact that it does not sell customer information to outside parties. It is merely a tool to keep people in touch with the groups they belong to such as schools or sports teams.

Your PTA Board chose to utilize this system this year for 3 main reasons:

- 1. Create volunteer groups based on our needs (Book Fair, Watch DOGS, Library, etc) so that we can contact each group when there is a need.
- 2. Communicate with everyone on general information such as Texas Roadhouse Bite Nights or sending future editions of the PTA newsletter.
- 3. Print the school wide school directory with the click of a button once we felt we had captured everyone. <u>This is a very important point as we must have your student in this system in order for him/her to be included in the school-wide directory.</u>

Your email address is never visible to ANYONE--once you are entered, even the PTA officers that act as administrators cannot see your email so you will not receive emails soliciting your business for any product or service. You will always have access to all of your information for your family to change or edit as you need.

All of you who have signed up to volunteer or who have purchased PTA memberships, t-shirts, yearbooks, etc. during registration or Meet the Teacher nights are already in our system and we have ensured that your decision to be included or excluded in the printed directory has been carefully recorded in the system. For those of you who have recently provided us with your information for the school directory, please be watching for an email from Just Between Friends. Follow the links and sign in to start your account and then check back for announcements and calendar updates or watch your email for information regarding the programs and activities you are interested in.
