Passing periods are 4 minutes long between each class.




FLEX Schedule



WHAT IS STOPIT?

The district has adopted Stopit as their new reporting app and will replace SafeSchools. With <u>STOPit</u>, you have the power to protect yourself and others from harmful, inappropriate, or unsafe behavior. Use the STOPit mobile app to anonymously report incidents to your school. Reporting is completely anonymous. You can include text, images or video. It only takes a few seconds. Report incidents such as:

- Bullying
- · Cyberbullying or cyber abuse
- Harassment
- Violence, threats, or weapons possession
- · Alcohol or drug-related issues
- Hazing
- Discrimination
- · Ethics violations such as cheating or plagiarism

To get started you can download the app from either the Google Play or Apple App store and obtain your access code from your campus.
