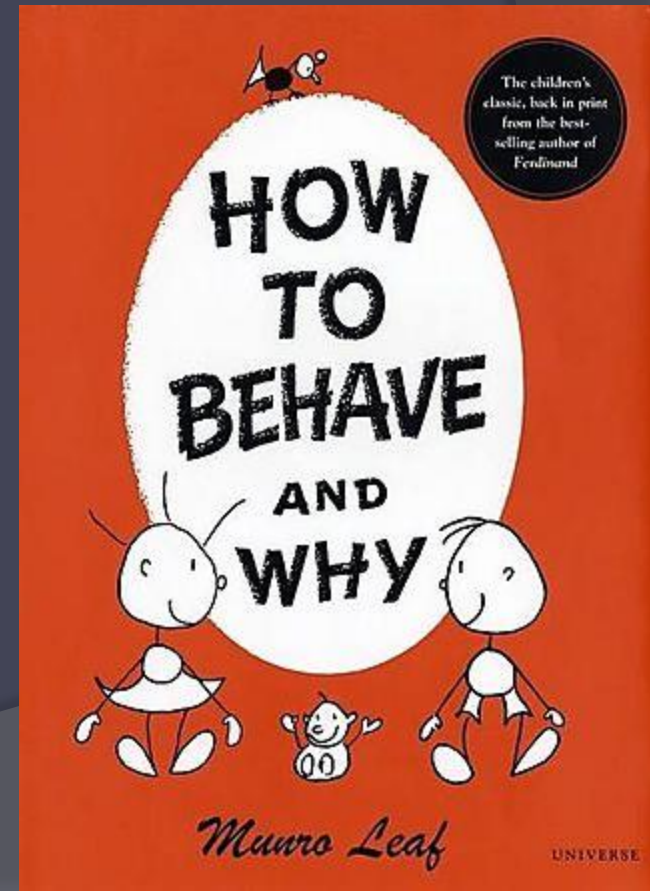
lenient

- *Grandparents are much more lenient about candy and treats than parents.*



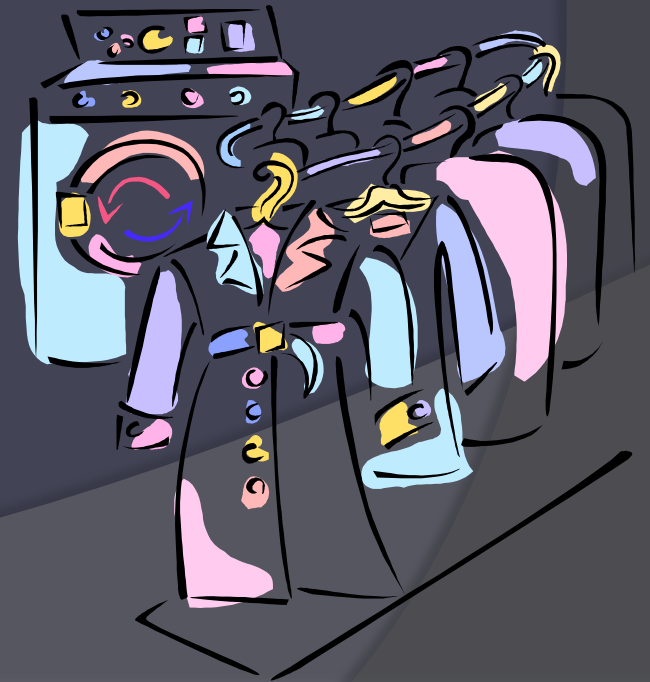
etiquette

- *The gargantuan King Kong perched atop the Empire State Building.*



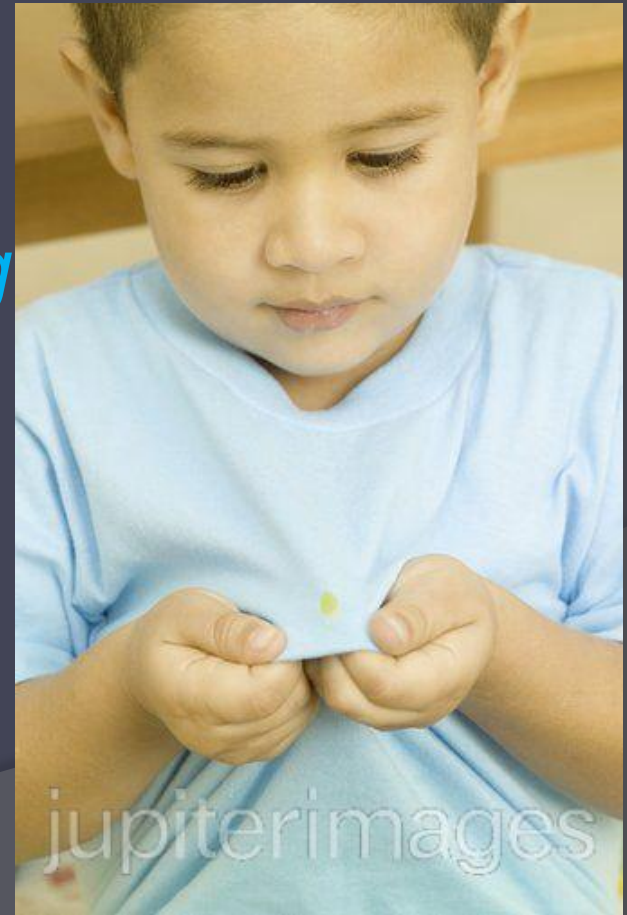
cherish
