



DHS Bullying Prevention Committee Information provided by DHS Counseling office

DHS believes all students have the right to attend school where individual differences are respected and celebrated and to learn in a safe, secure and supportive environment that is free of bullying. Unfortunately, bullying behavior sometimes occurs in the school setting. DHS has recently stepped up its efforts against bullying with the formation of a prevention committee whose members consist of administration, counselors, the SRO, teachers, staff, parents and students. The mission of the committee is to develop and nurture a learning community in which all members understand and demonstrate respect, responsibility, integrity, self-discipline, dignity and foster a caring environment. Current objectives set by the committee include providing awareness of unacceptable behaviors, provide bullying prevention education, engage students, staff, parents and community members in our effort to prevent bullying, and provide support for victims of bullying, bystanders and bullies. In an effort to achieve parent collaboration it is vital that parents understand what constitutes bullying, know the types of bullying, recognize warning signs that their child may be experiencing bullying and/or is engaging in bullying behavior and know where to seek

Definition of Bullying

Bullying is a form of overt and aggressive behavior that is intentional, hurtful, and persistent.

- It is intentional hurtful behavior physically and/or emotionally.
- It is a pattern of behavior that is repetitive.
- It involves an imbalance of power and/or strength.

Types of Bullying

- Direct- physical (hitting, pushing, slapping, spitting) and/or verbal (name calling, malicious teasing, taunting, threatening).
- Indirect- this type of bullying is more subtle and includes behaviors such as social isolation, exclusion, lies, rumors and/or reputation slandering.
- Cyber bullying- the use of technology to tease, intimidate, defame, send hurtful messages, threaten, and/or cause harm. Cyber bullying can be done through means such as texting, email, digital pictures, videos, and website postings (including Facebook, Instagram, blogs, Twitter or other means).

Warning Signs that a Child is Being Bullied

- Unexplainable injuries;
- Lost or destroyed clothing, books, electronics, or jewelry;
- Frequent headaches or stomach aches, feeling sick or faking illness;
- Changes in eating habits, like suddenly skipping meals or binge eating. Kids may come home from school hungry because they did not eat lunch;
- Difficulty sleeping or frequent nightmares;
- Declining grades, loss of interest in schoolwork, or not wanting to go to school;
- Sudden loss of friends or avoidance of social situations;
- Feelings of helplessness or decreased self-esteem; and/or
- Self-destructive behaviors such as running away from home, harming themselves, or talking about suicide.

(Please note that not all children who experience bullying will exhibit warning signs.)

Warning Signs that a Child is Bullying Others

- Get into physical or verbal fights;
- Have friends who bully others;
- Are increasingly aggressive;
- Get sent to the principal's office or to detention frequently;
- Have unexplained extra money or new belongings;
- Blame others for their problems;
- Don't accept responsibility for their actions; and/or
- Are competitive and worry about their reputation or popularity.

Seeking Help

Parents need to understand that the majority of children do not report bullying to their parents and/or other adults. This could be because of several reasons:

- Feelings of helpless. Many teens want to handle it on their own to feel in control again or they may fear being seen as weak or a snitch.
- Many teens fear retaliation from the bully.
- Bullying can be a humiliating experience. Some teens may not want their parents or other adults to know what is being said about them, whether true or false. They may also fear that their parents or other adults will judge them and/or punish them for being weak.
- Kids who are bullied may already feel socially isolated.
 They may feel like no one cares or could understand.
- Kids may fear rejection by their peers. Friends can help protect kids from bullying, and kids can fear losing this support.

If you suspect your child is being bullied:

- 1. Be Supportive and gather information:
 - Talk with your child and find out what has happened. Ask them who all was involved in the bullying. Get the facts.
 - Talk with your child about cyber bullying and monitor their internet activity.
 - Listen without blaming your child and assure them that it is not their fault.
 - Never tell your child to ignore the bullying, especially if they report the bullying to you. This could send the message that you are going to ignore it. Ignoring it could only make the problem more serious.
 - Do not encourage physical retaliation.
- 2. Contact your child's teacher, counselor, and/or Assistant Principal:
 - Keep your emotions in check. Give factual information about your child's experience of being bullied—who, what, when, where, and how.
 - Work with the staff at school to find a solution to stop the bullying, for the sake of your child as well as other students.
 - Do not contact the parents of the student(s) who bullied your child.
 - Expect the bullying to stop. Talk regularly with your child and with school staff to see if the bullying has stopped. If the bullying persists, contact school authorities again.
- 3. Help your child become more resilient to bullying:
 - Help develop talents or positive attributes of your child such as getting them involved in after school programs, art activities, or athletics.
 - Encourage your child to reach out to their friends at school and in their classes. Bystanders have a major impact on stopping bullying behaviors.

- Talk with your child about safety strategies such as seeking help from an adult, discuss adults at school your child would feel comfortable talking to, and assure your child that reporting is not the same as snitching.
- Get your child involved in the community and encourage them to make friends outside of school.
- Evaluate your child's social skills. If your child is hyperactive, impulsive or overly talkative the bully may be reacting out of annoyance. While this does not make the bullying right, it could help you understand why your child is being bullied. If your child easily irritates others seek help from a counselor so your child can better learn the informal social rules of his/her peers.
- Provide a safe and loving home environment where the lines of communication are always open.

If You Suspect Your Child is Bullying

It's hard for any parent to believe that their child is a bully, but sometimes it happens. But just because your child bullies doesn't mean that he or she will bully forever. Parents are one of the best resources to help their child stop bullying and start interacting positively with their classmates.

- Take it seriously. Don't treat bullying as a passing phase.
 Even if you're not worried about long-lasting effects on your child, another child is being hurt.
- Talk to your child to find out why he or she is bullying.
 Often, children bully when they feel sad, angry, lonely, or
 insecure and many times major changes at home or school
 may bring on these feelings. Sometimes children bully to
 fit in. Gaining an understanding of why your child is
 bullying will help you in seeking additional support for
 your child as needed.
- Help build empathy for others and talk to your child about how it feels to be bullied.
- Use consequences that involve learning or building empathy such as having them write a letter of apology, volunteer in the community to help others, write about the effects of bullying, do a good deed for the person who was bullied, and clean up, repair or pay for any property they damaged.
- Ask a teacher or a school counselor if your child is facing any problems at school, such as if your child is struggling with a particular subject or has difficulty making friends. Ask them for advice on how you and your child can work through the problem.
- Ask yourself if someone at home is bullying your child.
 Often, kids who bully are bullied themselves by a parent, family member, or another adult.

Steps Parents Can Take to Prevent Bullying

- Talk about bullying with your child.
- Help your child understand what bullying is and how to respond to bullying.
- Encourage your child not to be an innocent bystander, but to stand up against bullying by not giving the bully his/her desired attention, telling the bully to stop (if they feel comfortable doing so), and/or by reporting the bullying.
- Keep the lines of communication open.
- Support your child and encourage them to do what they love.
- Model how to treat others with kindness and respect.
- Get involved. Parents can contribute to a positive school climate through the parent teacher association, volunteering, and school improvement events.


