Members of the Denton High School Chess Club have completed their rated competitions for the 2012-2013 academic year, including a trip by five juniors and seniors to SuperNationals V. The SuperNationals V chess tournament was held April 5-7 at the Gaylord Opryland Hotel and Convention Center in Nashville, TN. At SuperNationals V, Alex Elizalde, Jason Van Horn, William Root, Luis Guevara, and Austin McGregor played 7 games of up to 4 hours each alongside 5,330 other K-12 scholastic chess players from across the country.

On **May 25**, middle and high school students will compete in a non-rated tournament with members of the Denton High School chess club. 

DHS COUNSELING NEWS

NAVIANCE Planning—the next big thing for DHS Freshmen! The DHS Counseling Team will be working with all 9th graders through their English classes April 18-29. There will be a classroom presentation regarding four year high school planning during their English 1 class period. This will occur at least one day before the students are taken into labs to enter their plan into the NAVIANCE computer system.

After classroom presentations to be held on April 18-23, students will be encouraged to take their handouts home with them, work on them with you and bring them back to their English class the very next time the class meets on April 24-25. If you or your students have any questions regarding this planning process, the contact information for the following personnel is provided at the bottom of this article. Please feel free to call or email:

- Mrs. Keith/Career Counselor, regarding the elective career opportunities.
- Mr. Lydia/9th Grade Counselor, regarding academic core selection (Pre-AP, AP, etc.).
- Beth Hughes/IB Diploma Program Coordinator regarding the IB Diploma and/or Certificate Programs.

Parents and guardians--we realize that high school four year planning can be overwhelming as your student tries to consider ALL of his/her academic and elective options. Currently, the 4 x 4 is in place requiring students to graduate with 4 of each core subject (Math, Science, English, Social Studies). Therefore, for this section, students only need to select the level of the core classes they wish to take (Pre-AP, AP, etc.).

Since half of their plan (the core) is already mandated for them, most of their analysis should be spent on the elective section of their plan. We want you to know that Denton ISD provides students with one of the largest elective course selections in the state of Texas, especially regarding career opportunities at their home campus and the Advanced Technology Complex.

The goal of this activity is for students to create a plan that they may actually use as a guideline for their course selections from year to year, a plan that will allow them to sample meaningful electives which assist them in narrowing down their college and career goals prior to selecting a post-secondary institution, college major, or career.

<u>Please know that their plan is:</u> • NOT set in stone • NOT their course request • ONLY a guideline that can be altered in the future

So, while we do want these to be as accurate as possible, we do not intend for anyone to stress out over it. Again, call the contacts mentioned above as necessary. Their information is below. We are very excited about being able to offer this computerized opportunity to our students! We look forward to working with you on this process!

The boys JV soccer team culminated a dominant district campaign with a 6-0 win over Lake Dallas. The young men represented Denton High School with pride and class as they followed up a tough 1-4-2 pre district record with an extraordinary 8-1-0 district performance. The strong showing earned the Bronco Team top honors among all other district JV teams. Along the way, the Bronco boys outscored their district opponents by a remarkable 31-5 margin. Leading the offensive charge for the Broncos was Sam ReCalderon, with 11 goals, and Juan Borda, with 9 assists. Rigels Diko, Tyler Beisel, and Braeden Petri also contributed to a strong midfield for the Broncos. The stingy defense was anchored by Daniel Olvera, Chris Penny, Alex Karrlson and Jordan Kingand between the pipes, goalkeeper, Gio Gomez, led the team with 5 clean sheets. Freshman, Wesley Maffey-Kohler also made a statement with several strong performances throughout the season. Each and every team member made important contributions to the success the JV team this season. The advertising pages are divided into **four** sections. **Each section purchased will cost the following:**

- 1/8 page: 60.00 early bird special \$48 (up to 2 pictures and 20 words or 1 picture and 35 words)
- 1/4 page: 105.00 early bird special \$84 (up to 4 pictures and 45 words or 2-3 pictures and 80 words)
- 1/2 page: 200.00 early bird special \$160 (up to 6 pictures and 125 words)
- Full page: 325.00 early bird special \$260 (up to 10 pictures and 175 words)

***Pictures and wording are approximations depending on font type and picture size. Advertisers may buy multiple pages of ads but must fill out separate contracts for each page.

TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL AD EXPERIENCE DO:

- submit quality prints (color) that are free of scratches, tears, creases, etc.
- attach a mailing label or piece of paper with your name on the back of photos
- if submitting digital photos, send on a CD with a resolution of **300 dpi** at desired size. A lower dpi will result in poor quality or pixilation
- bring in photos, let us scan the original so the quality is at 300 dpi
- **type** or print the message as it should appear in the ad and spell check prior to submission
- photos will be returned when books deliver in May

DO NOT:

- cut photos; photos can be reduced/enlarged to fit the ad or cropped digitally
- submit naked baby photos or photos with guns, alcohol or tobacco products (also please be mindful of excluding photos with revealing dress - i.e. bikinis or other high/low cut attire).
