DHS Host Families Needed!!!!

Would your family like to experience life in Denton through a different set of eyes?

Every two years DHS is visited by students from our partner school in Haßfurt, Germany. This year they will be here from March 19th-April 5th. The German students are all 11th graders and have been studying English for at least 7 years. They are from the Regio-Montanus-Gymnasium and are here to experience life in Denton, Texas. We are currently in need host families for 2 of them.

The RMG student will be a member of your family during the 2.5 weeks that they are here. The German students pay for their own entertainment and various activities related to trips with the GAPP* group while they are here. Your hosting responsibilities would simply include providing room and board during their stay and providing transportation to and from school. They do not have to have their own guest room and, if your child rides a bus to school,

the German student can ride as well!

While host families merely need to be willing to share their lives with their guest from Germany, DHS students who wish to participate in the second half of the exchange must be enrolled in an advanced German class at DHS. The Germany side of the exchange is designed to provide an opportunity to practice and improve their language skills prior to taking the AP exam or college placement tests. The focus is on language use and cultural interaction. Students get to live as the Germans do for the three weeks that we are in their country. On a case by case basis, advanced students who have taken World History and are enrolled in an advanced level of a World Language may be considered for participation; however, they must interview with the selection committee, attend the GAPP classes after school during the second semester and work with Mrs. Dieckman or a tutor to pick up basic language skills.

Denton Record-Chronicle Gives Shout-Out To DHS Swimmers!!!

The Denton Broncos swim team, led by a pair of freshmen, Janna Herron and Seth Hermann, grabbed second place finishes in the boys and girls divisions at the District 6-5A Swim and Dive Championships in Grapevine and will have contestants in 19 events to the UIL Class 5A regionals.

Guyer and Ryan will also be well represented at the Class 6A regionals in Lewisville on Feb. 5-6 as they qualified in 13 events Saturday at the District 5-6A meet in Keller.

The Denton girls placed second behind host-team Grapevine in the 6-5A meet. Grapevine finished with 192 points while Denton had 117. Grapevine also won the boys division with 214 points with Denton in second at 94.

Herron took first place in two events.

She grabbed first in the 100 freestyle with a time of 59.49, just ahead of Grapevine's Jordyn Arendse at 1:00.20 and Denton teammate Delia Breedlove at 1:00.43. Later she captured first in the 100 breaststroke with a time of 1:13.72 while teammate Rachel Crews took second at 1:15.52. Herron was also a member of the winning 200 medley relay team.

Hermann won the 100 freestyle title with a time of 52.08 while Grapevine's Corey Beitler was second at 52.11.

Hermann also got a first place trophy as a member of Denton's winning 400 freestyle relay.

The Denton girls' 200 medley relay quartet of Megan Harbin, Herron, Delia Breedlove and Rachael Crews opened the meet by claiming first with a time of 2:01.36, well ahead of second place finisher Grapevine at 2:04.01.

Denton's boys 400 freestyle relay unit of Josh Rowell, Rayce Richter, Luigi Erba and Hermann easily won the event with a time of 3:42.06 with Azle finishing a distant second at 4:11.84.

The decision to close schools based on inclement weather is made when possible by 6:30 a.m. School closing decisions are reported on the Denton ISD Website, the Denton Record-Chronicle Online and on the major television networks: Channel 4 (KDFW), Channel 5 (KXAS), Channel 8 (WFAA), Channel 11 (KTVT), Channel 23 (KUVN) and Channel 39 (KXTX). The major radio stations include: FM 88.1 (KNTU), AM 820 (WBAP), AM 1080, (KRLD), and others.

It is also announced on the district's main telephone line at (940) 369-0000. This year, we will use our automated Call-out system for weather alerts. Please be sure to have your current contact information on file with each school your child(ren) attends. You can also sign-up to receive an e-Alert in your email.

Please note: Media outlets only inform viewers and listeners of those school districts that are either starting late or canceling school. If no information is given, Denton ISD will be starting at the regular time.
