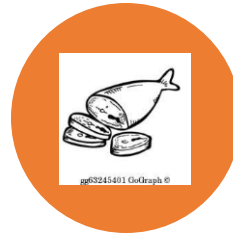

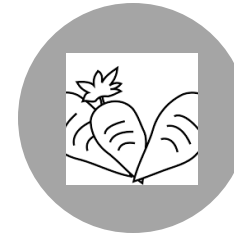

What is a reimbursable meal for breakfast?

A food item is a specific food offered in a **reimbursable breakfast** from the three food components.

A school must offer at least four food items from the three required food components (fruits, grains, milk).

What is a reimbursable meal for lunch?

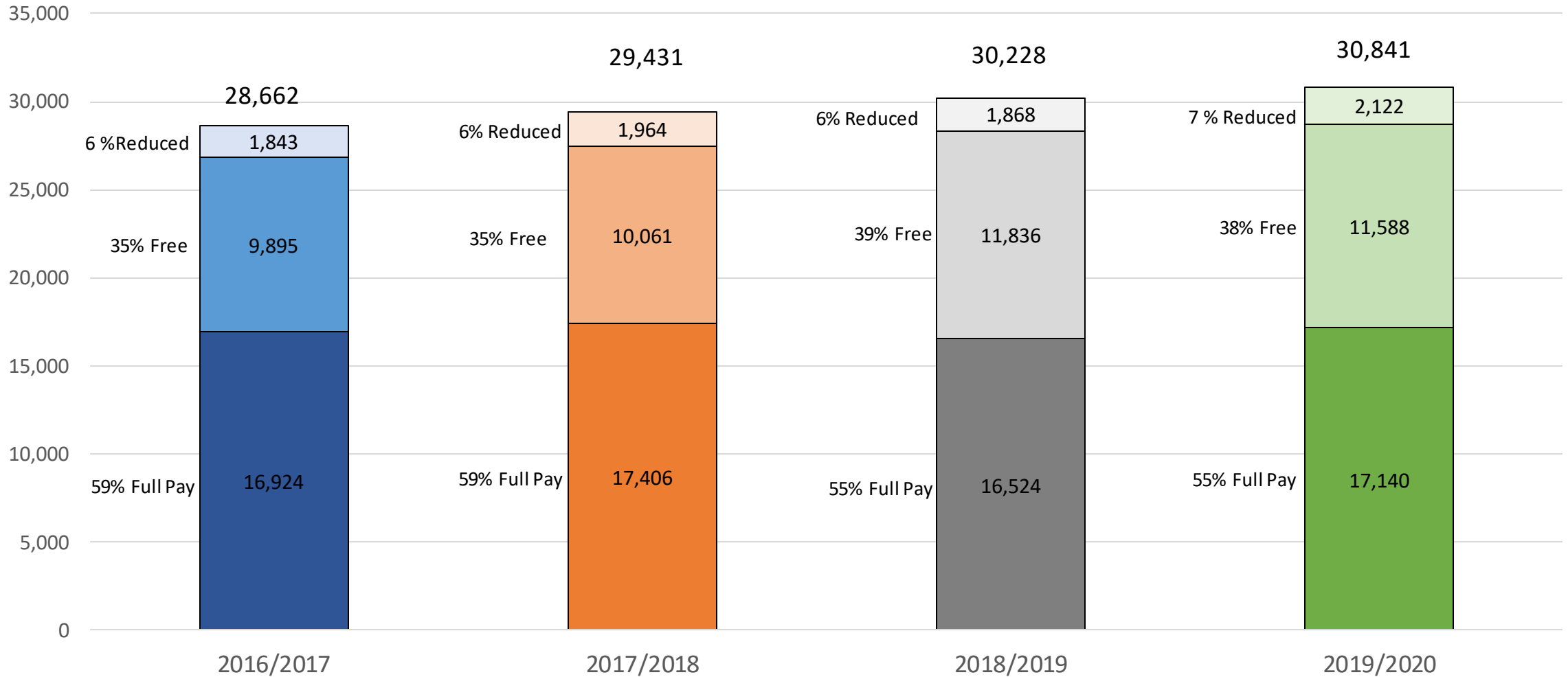
A reimbursable lunch includes the selection of three or more of the components (meat/meat alternate, vegetables, fruits, bread grains and fluid milk) and one of the components must be a minimum ½ cup of fruits and/or vegetables.

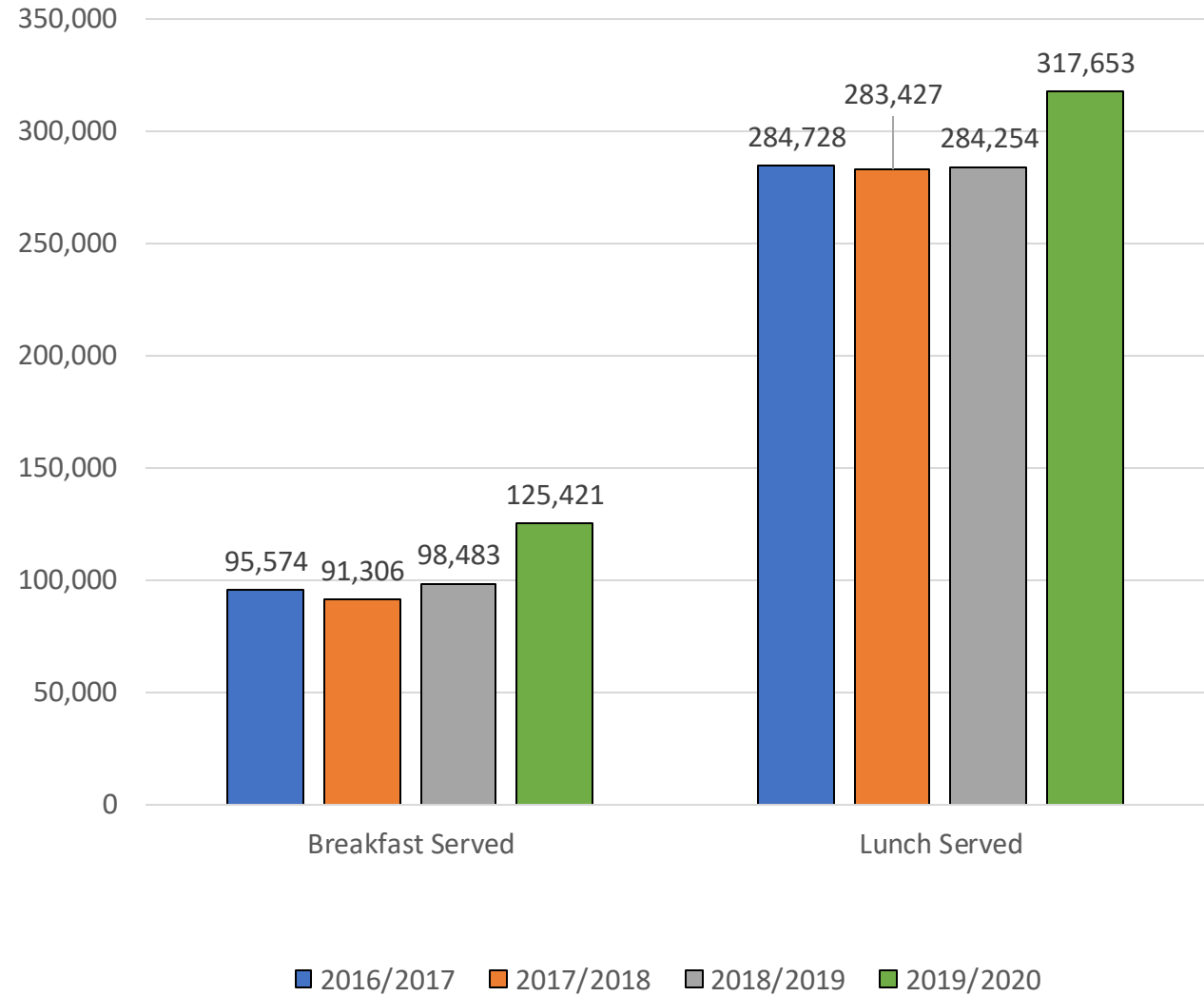

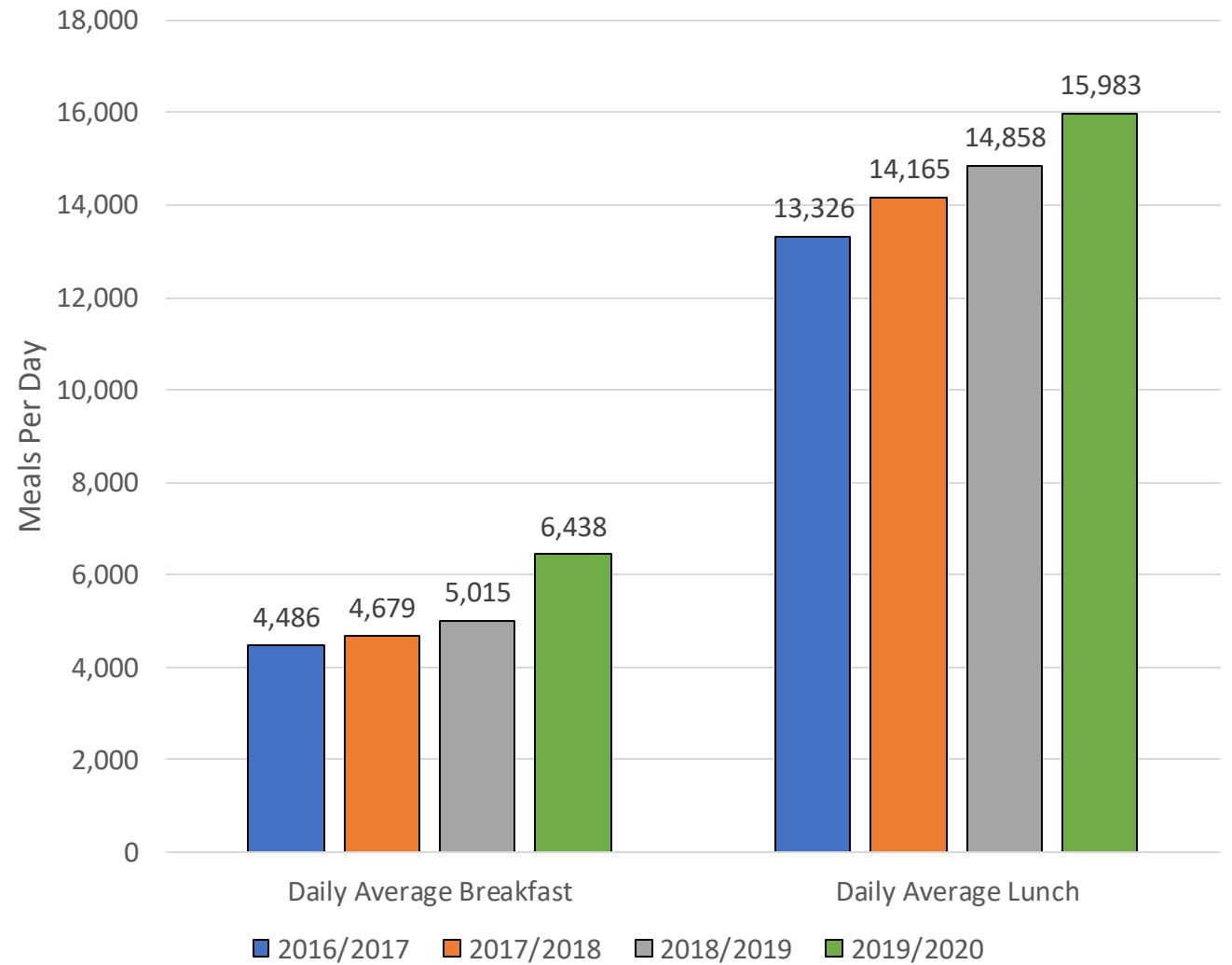
Population Economics



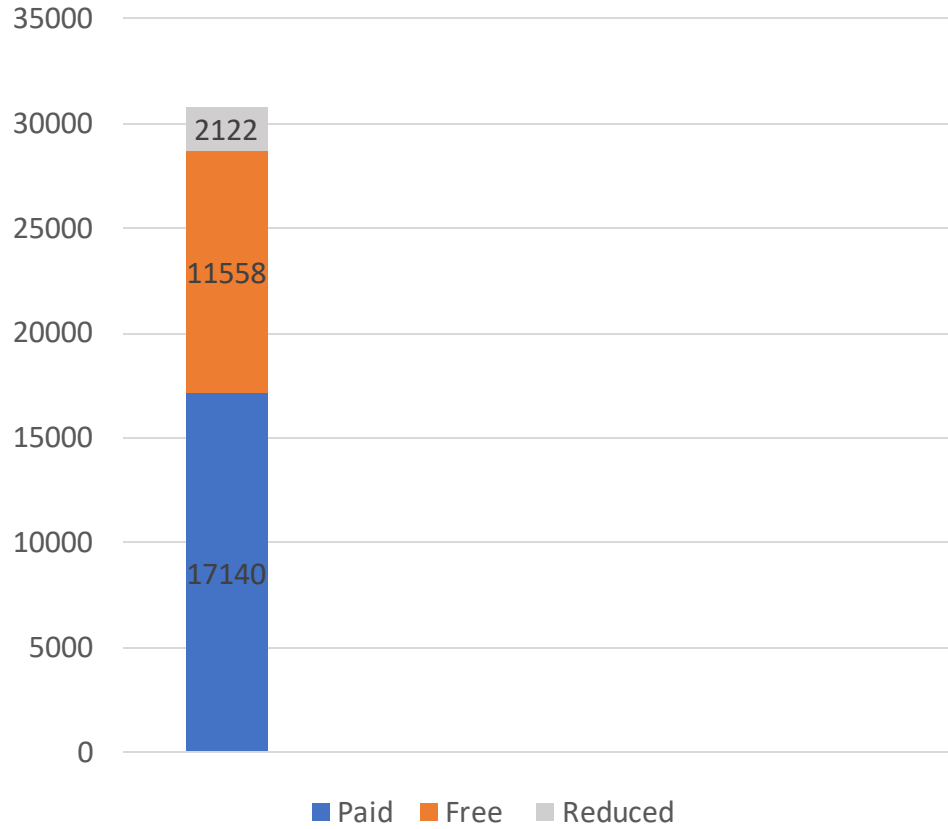
Meal Counts September



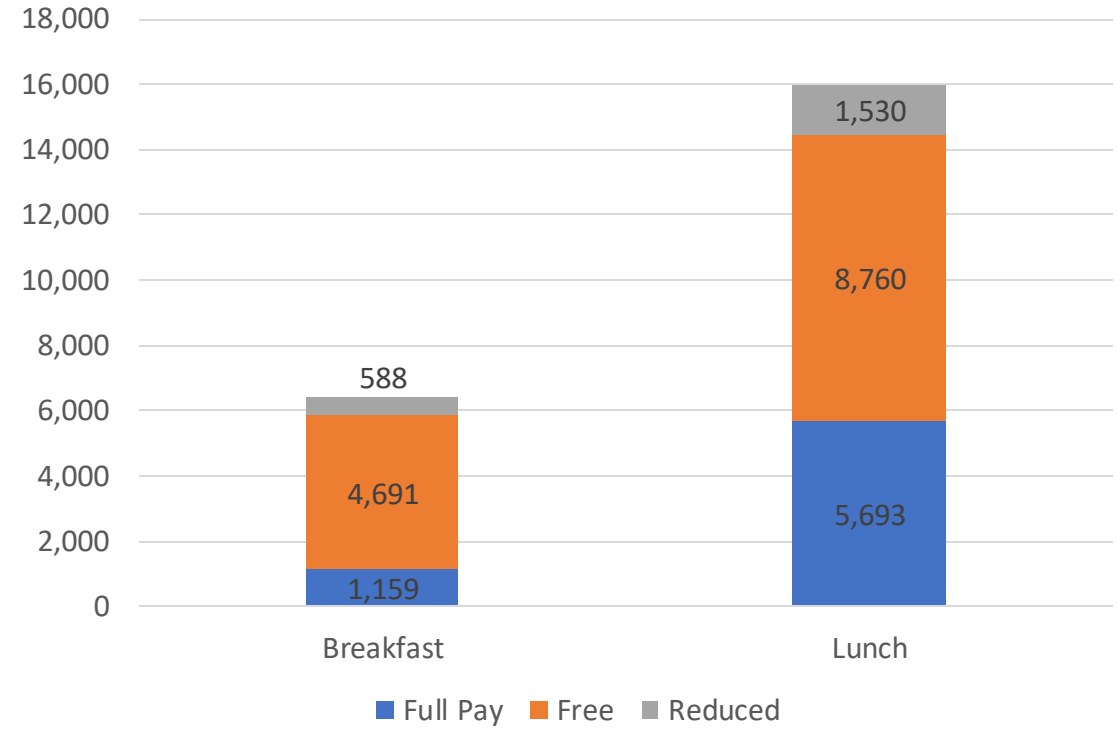
Average Daily Meal Counts



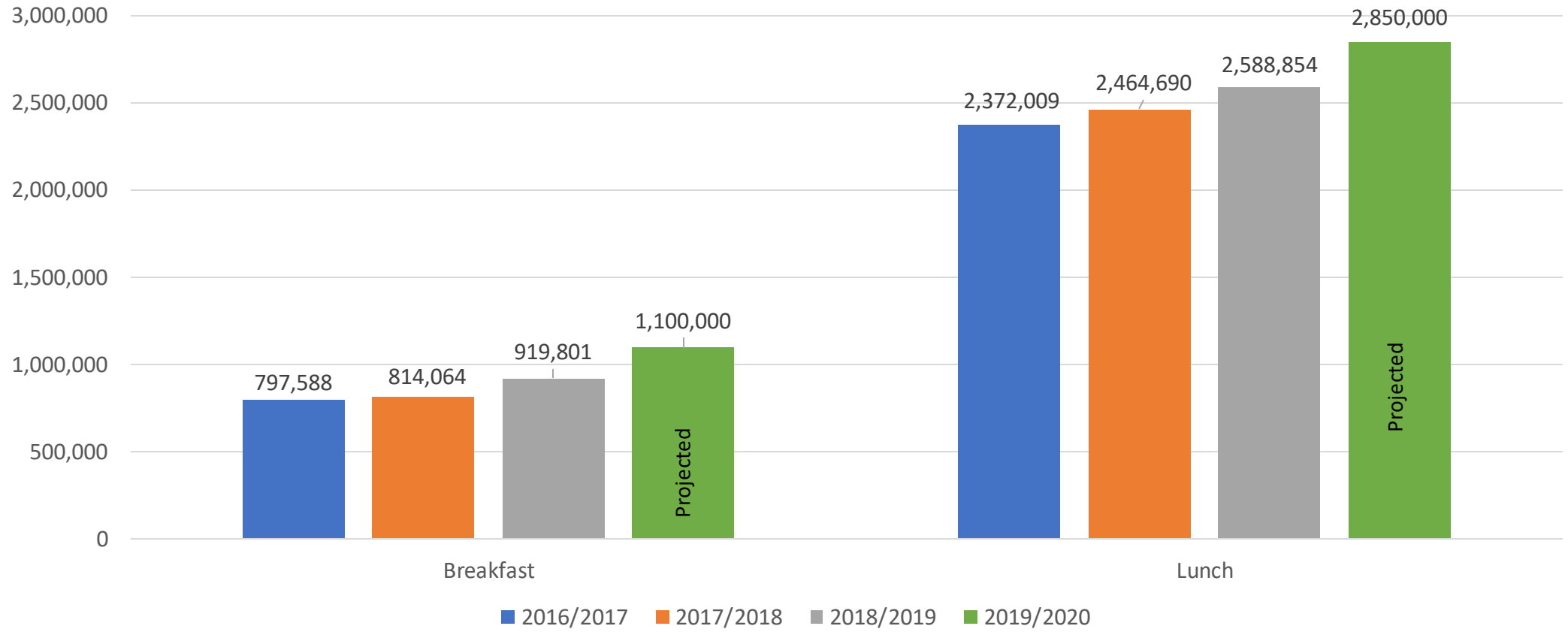
Total Population



Who is Eating

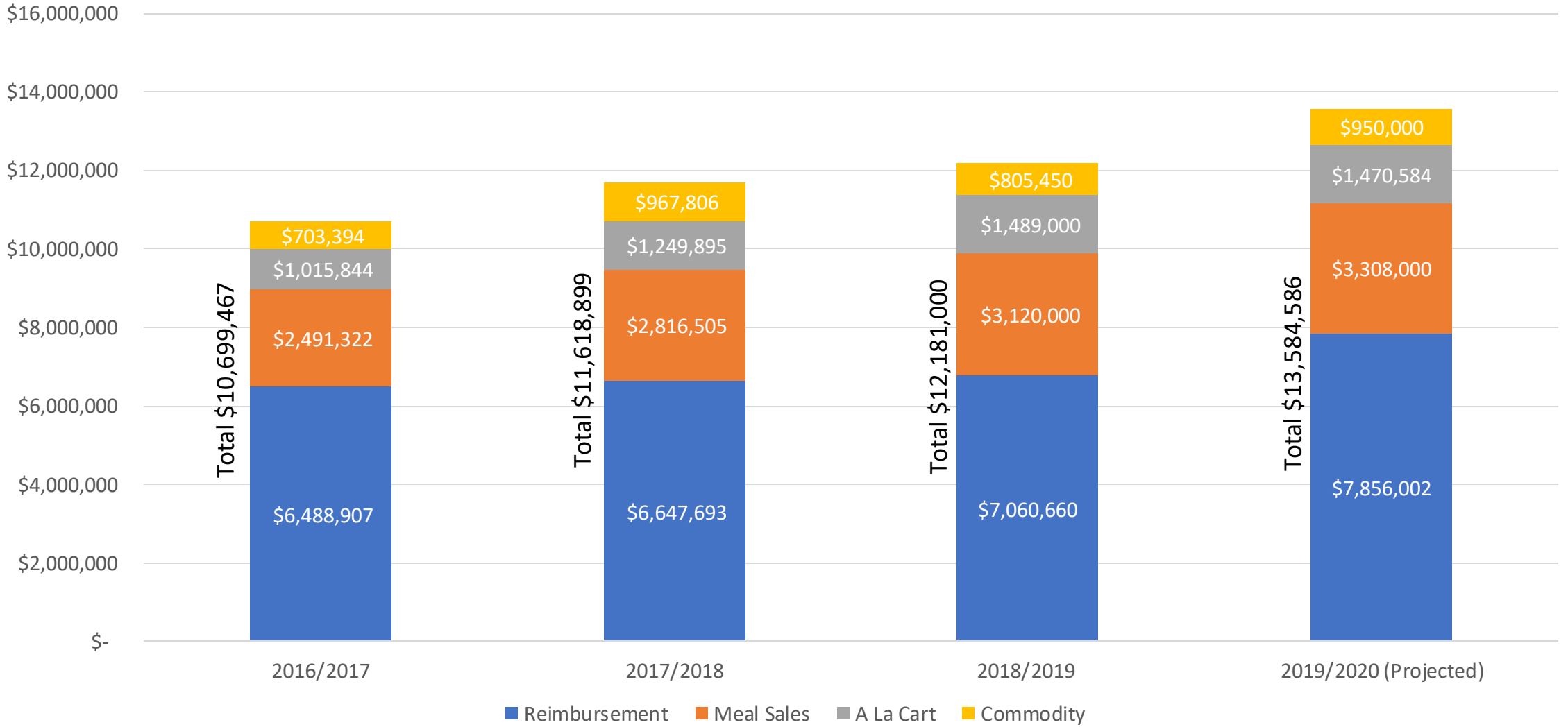
