<u>Dr. Beth Kelly,</u> Principal at Cheek Middle School, welcomed everyone to Cheek. Dr. Kelly said it's very inspiring for our staff and students and community to have this beautiful facility. She feels very fortunate that we have people who are very focused on the future of our community, the future of our

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students and their needs. We prioritize our kids having the best and most equitable learning environments possible. The investment that we're making in our district is not just based on growth, it's based on the needs of every student that we serve. Thank you for everything that you've done to encourage our community to understand the value of having a facility like this for students. We have about 740 students currently. I anticipate next year that the number is going to jump dramatically because 8th graders who were at Rodriguez and Navo had the option of remaining there, so next year we'll have a larger 8th grade group. I want to welcome you here and thank you for all the work that you've done to make this possible.

<u>Dr. Jaime Wilson</u>, Superintendent, Thanked Dr. Kelly. You can see the common thread through committee whenever we work on this. It wasn't just about addressing growth. Growth, of course, was being done, but also making sure that we have replacement school or renovating facilities and those things across the district as well and. Everyone, whether we were building a new school or renovating a school, they recognize the commitment our community makes, so thank you.

<u>Nancy Murphy-Chadwick</u>, committee co-chair, welcomed everyone and informed the committee that herself and Dean Anthony are co-chairs of the committee. Nancy recognized LaQuita Harmon for stepping up and helping present at the September 26, 2023, board meeting. Nancy then called for the minutes for the September 13, 2023, meeting to be approved. Motion by Crystal Wright and seconded by Rod Reeves to approve the minutes.

Dr. Jaime Wilson called the meeting to order at 12:20 pm.

<u>Dr. Jaime Wilson,</u> Superintendent, welcomed Rocky Gardiner here to take us through the growth report. We do this twice a year with this committee, and quarterly with the board. This is the 3rd Quarter growth as of the end of September.

<u>Rocky Gardiner</u>, Zonda, where we are at right now of 32,905 for enrollment with a projection of 362 student growth.

Strong economy means strong housing growth with unemployment rates below 5%. Once interest rates started to climb, the housing market flattened out because people just couldn't get into homes. Builders start to work off their inventory, then starts to fall below closings. We can see that is going back up over 43,000 and closing over 50,000, so that's the most closings that we have seen in a very long time.

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### Key takeaways:

- Denton ISD added nearly 362 students this fall as the housing market continues to have record high closings in the region.
- Based on current trends, Denton ISD could close more than 3,200 homes by the end of 2023, the most annual closings the district has ever experienced
- The district has 58 active subdivisions with lots available to build on and 31 future subdivisions with lots in various stages of development.
- Groundwork is underway on roughly 2,540 lots across the district.
- The district is forecasted to enroll more than 36,800 students in 2028/29, and almost 41,600 students in 2033/34

<u>Sarah Simpson</u>, Director of Budget and Bonds, went over the financials of the remaining balances of the 2018 bond and the 2023 bond budgets that have begun with a side by side comparison. The 2018 Bond financials focus on Newton Rayzor Elementary and Calhoun Middle School budgets. The 2023 Bond financials focus on Hill Elementary and Martinez Elementary School budgets.
