This is a busy time of year for you, but as you are aware we

are facing a crisis in education. As I'm sure you know, Texas' budget shortfall translates into a statewide funding decline of roughly \$1,000 per student.

You are likely feeling the impact of this funding deficit as you begin this new year, and of course, this serious situation has consequences well beyond the current school year. Save Texas Schools (SaveTXSchools.org) is a nonpartisan statewide volunteer coalition. We are working to inform voters, parents, educators, and elected officials about the importance of maintaining funding for Texas public education.

Save Texas Schools has recently launched a DFW chapter that hosted an area conference September 23-24 to disseminate information about this crisis and let participants know what they can do to effect change.

We want to help you be informed and involved, and we know your time is precious. Here is a list of a few things you can do, all of which will take just a few minutes.
