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Greetings Broncos! I hope everyone is doing well during this cold, wet and snowy winter. They say, "It's good to get a kid into something before the kid gets into something." That goes without saying this semester. Things around DHS are active and energetic. Spring is full of various activities and students are pulled in many different directions. Academics, athletics and second semester activities are a constant source for participation and involvement.

Your students have been going through the course selection process for the upcoming 2010/2011 school year. You should have a verification sheet coming your way soon so please be on the lookout for it. If you are interested in graduation requirements please check out the DISD website under House Bill 3. Although changes have been made regarding "requirements" our elective courses are dictated by our highly qualified status of teaching credentials. Alternative courses will be critical this year so please make sure your student makes his/her selections. Once certain courses are filled, the alternatives become the default choice.

TAKS testing is just around the corner with English Language Arts/Reading taking place on March 3, 2010. All freshmen, sophomores and juniors will be in testing that day. The TAKS test is an untimed test and should be taken seriously by all students. If a student does not do well on any portion of the TAKS test he/she will most likely be placed in a TAKS prep class the following school year replacing an elective credit and helping solidify the student's academic foundation. Please encourage your student to do his/her best and be proud of their effort. If your student needs help preparing for any portion of the TAKS test, every Saturday we have tutorials on campus from 9:00 a.m. to noon. Sections are split between math, science and ELA (pick two). Each section is 90 minutes long and lunch is served at noon. Help us Conquer TAKS!

DHS Teacher of the Year David Mairs

DAVID MAIRS was presented the 2009/2010 DHS Teacher of the Year award on January 4, 2010, during a staff breakfast in the cafeteria. Mairs, Denton High School's orchestra director, has more than 30 years of teaching experience, with the past four years being in the DHS Fine Arts Department.

Mairs' professional development includes writing music and assisting in the production of the DHS Veteran's Day celebration and the DHS graduation. He led a DISD Orchestra Directors' Workshop on using *Finale*, a music writing program and was chosen to lead the 2009 Texas All-State Symphony Orchestra Brass Section for the third consecutive year. He hosted and was actively involved in the Region 2 All-Region Orchestra Clinic and Concerts in 2007, 2008 and 2009, and led a DISD Orchestra Directors' Workshop on New Music for String Orchestra.

In 2005 he was recognized by the American Symphony Orchestra League for 10 years of leadership as music director of the Mid-Texas Symphony, and he was a 1999 recipient of the Ford Motor Company's Salute to Education Honoree In Arts Education.

Mairs sums up his teaching philosophy in five words, "It's all about the kids!" He believes that, "in music, working with precious, valuable, vulnerable individuals, young or old, the process is the product." He does not consider himself an "outstanding pedagogue," but a "good musician" and a good "encourager."

DHS Teacher of the Year Nominees

Teacher of the Year applications reflect the nominees' professional development, community service, awards and teaching philosophies. They are reviewed by academic leaders and DHS administration before submitting ballots that determine the winner. Nominated teachers must have taught in the Denton ISD at least three consecutive years and not have won for their campus in the last five years. DHS teachers nominated for 2009-2010 DHS Teacher of the Year include:



Foreign Languages: Jamie Covey's professional development and awards not only include DHS activities, but also the Junior ROTC, military activities and the American Sign Language Teachers Association. DHS awards include DHS Teacher of

the Month, Most Inspiring Teacher, Most Spirited Teacher and she received Best Classroom recognition five consecutive years. Her military awards include the Army Accommodation Medal, Sailor of the Quarter Nominee and the United States Navy Rear-Admiral's Leadership Award. Covey was also listed in Who's Who Among American High School Teachers.



Deaf Education: Jennifer Frye—Ranging from 1977 to 2009, Frye's professional development includes many activities involving deaf education and English language arts. Her awards include DHS Teacher of the Month in 2001, and several appreciation awards for services relating to deaf ministries and

organizations.



Math Department: Stephanie Nicewarner - Included among Nicewarner's professional developments and awards is her service on the IB implementation group and the DHS Instructional Committee, and she was on the book selection committee and assisted in writing

the Scope and Sequence for Geometry for the district. In 2007 she was a reviewer for NASA's High School Aerospace Scholars Program, where she served as a counselor for three years. She received the NLU Presidential Scholarship, and completed her master's degree in 2008.



English Department: Chris Puente – Puente's professional development and awards include the Sid W. Richardson Scholarship for Journalism Educators, DHS Best Dressed Teacher and DHS Teacher of the Month.



Science Department: Rhana Ramos — Science workshops, IB workshops and coaches clinics comprise Ramos' professional development. She was also named Teacher of the Year at her previous school, Thomas Jefferson High School.



Health & PE: Ian Scott — Scott is a Texas Department of Health licensed athletic trainer who graduated from the University of Texas at Arlington with a bachelor of science degree in exercise science.



Social Studies: Reginald E. Seastrunk— Seastrunk served on the social studies committee that developed the new secondary scope and sequence. He also served as physical education coordinator for DISD

middle schools staff development. In 2009 his family received the Greater Denton Family of the Year Award, and in 2004/05 he was named the TABC Middle School Coach of the Year.



CTE: Molly Swindle - Swindle represents DHS as a member of the International Baccalaureate Steering Committee at Calhoun Middle School and is also a member of the Denton High Instructional Committee.

She was named DHS Career and Technology Education teacher of the month, and also was a Family, Career and Community Leaders of America Region II Master advisor.

NACLO is a contest for U.S. and Canadian high-school students in which contestants compete by solving compelling and creative puzzles using language and logic skills. Professionals in the computer and linguistics fields use dozens of languages to create engaging problems that represent cutting edge issues in their fields. The competition has attracted top students to study and work in those same fields. Results from the competition are expected in late February, 2010. Winners of this round of the NACLO will be invited to compete again in March. Grad Night 2010

We are in the planning stages of DHS Grad Night 2010. Grad Night has been a successful project for many years at Denton High School thanks to the generous support of the Denton community. It is planned and provided primarily by the parents of the graduating seniors.

Grad Night will cost about \$17,000 to provide our children with an event as successful as those held in previous years. The Grad Night committee must raise all funds used to pay for this event. So far, we have received some donations from previous Grad Nights, the Denton Public School Foundation and Denton High PTSA. Hopefully, we will receive additional support from businesses, families and individuals in our community.

The idea of Grad Night is to provide a safe, alcohol and drug-free graduation event for only DHS graduating seniors after the graduation ceremony on June 4, 2010. The event will include activities that will keep the grads busy all night: dancing, sports, games, auctions, drawings and food. Grads will have multiple opportunities to win Bronco Bucks that can be used to bid on prizes. Prizes in years past have included items that the students can use in their dorm rooms or apartments. They range from TV's, computers, telephones and mini refrigerators to gift certificates, cash prizes and much more.

Grad Night will be held at the Solana Spa in Westlake, which is an indoor-outdoor facility. Because of the distance and liability, all students must ride school buses to and from the event. Mr. Darrell Muncy has committed to provide the buses for this event.





Nurse Notes

Frequently students are temporarily in need of crutches/wheelchairs at school. If your teen is in this

situation, it is very important to notify me. I will need to visit with your child the morning of the 1st day they return to school as "temporarily handicapped." I can give them instructions that ensure their safety at school. If necessary I will notify teachers.

Please remind students to use the elevators. No elevator pass is required at DHS.

In the event of any evacuation, elevators cannot be used. Students who are told they may put some weight on the affected lower extremity, can have someone else carry their crutches down the stairs while the student holds on to the rail – once down they get the crutches back in order to exit the building.

Students who cannot bear weight (crutches/wheelchairs) are to remain in the classroom with an adult staff member. If a true evacuation is necessary, the staff member would move the student to a safe location. "Evacuation in Place" is the Fire Dept.'s approved plan in these special situations. No one is permitted to go up/dn stairs at school with crutches (& esp. wheelchairs- YIKES) at any time.

It is also important that I know if your student will be carrying a prescription for medication of any kind, please let me know ASAP, so I can make a note of it on their Health record. I am no longer requiring a Med. Use form to be signed by the parent.

For the safety of your child and other students, our district Medication Policy requires: 1) The medication must be in the original prescription bottle. 2) Ordered by the doctor to be given during school hours: i.e. 4x's per day or more often, at lunch, &/or PRN- as needed. (3x's per day meds are not to be brought to school) High School students may carry only one day's dose of the prescription medication and can self-administer at the water fountain. Any carrying of medication not in the original bottle and/or sharing medication is subject to disciplinary action. Thank you.

IB Informational meetings for parents of current sophomores and future freshmen that may be interested in the IB Middle Years Programme and IB Diploma Programme have been conducted. The meeting dates were posted on the DHS website as well as telephone call outs were made to parents.

Current IB DP students and prospective IB SP sophomores and their parents attended an **IB College Night** in Hurst, Tx on **January 25, 2010**. While attending the IB College Night, students had the opportunity to meet and visit with other IB students throughout the metroplex and of course visit with college representatives and find out offerings for IB students.

Seniors have registered for the IB external exams which will be held during the month of May. Seniors are busy developing and completing IB Internal Assessments, which will be combined with IB external exam grades for a final score. Seniors will not receive their IB test results until July, 2010, when IB releases all IB test scores throughout the world.

Juniors have been busy in their IB classes as one would expect, but they have also been busy earning Creativity, Service, and Action (CAS) hours. Approximately 832 hours have been earned by the juniors during the fall semester. An electronic project has been completed called *IB in Three Words*.
