International Baccalaureate Update



December 3rd and 4th marked the visit of the IB Authorization Site Visit Team to Denton High School. Over the course of the two day visit, the IB Team toured Denton High School and interviewed administration, teachers, students, parents, DISD School Board members, our superintendent, Dr. Braswell, as well as other Central Service Staff. The IB Authorization Site Visit Team was very impressed with Denton High School and the many resources available to students and teachers. They noted that all stakeholders had an understanding of the IB educational philosophy as well the expectations of the Diploma Programme for incoming juniors. The support and enthusiasm for IB was also noted. The IB Team applauded the newly renovated Renaissance International Garden, the Curriculum on the Wall (started by the teachers involved) project, along with fine arts facilities at DHS.

DHS will find out in April 2008, as to the status of our 'IB Authorization.' Until then a few fine tuning tasks will be undertaken. College Planning Kit

My College QuickStart is an easy-to-use, online, personalized college and career planning kit available free of charge to all students who take the PSAT/NMSQT. The information and answers your child provided when they took the test are incorporated into this useful tool, and it presents their data back to them in four main parts:

• My Online Score Report- an enhanced score report that allows students to review each test question, the student's answer, and the correct answer with answer explanations.

• My SAT Study Plan- a customized SAT study plan based on student PSAT/NMSQT test performance, highlighting skills for review and practice.

• My College Matches- A starter list of colleges based on the student's state and indicated choice of major.

• My Major and Career Matches- Major and career matches that are compatible with the student's general interests and personality type.

Access is available using the access code printed on the student's paper score report and this tool can be utilized throughout high school. Using My College QuickStart together with your child is a great way to introduce and guide your child through important aspects of the college-going process. From the DHS Nurse!

New research on teens in North America shows that a diet poor in essential vitamins and minerals and other antioxidant compounds is linked to increased risk for developing respiratory conditions including asthma, reduced lung function, and chronic bronchitis. These risks were highest among study subjects with the poorest diets who also smoked.

The results suggest that higher dietary intake of Vitamin A, C, E, and omega-3 fatty acids is linked to lower reports of cough, respiratory infections, and less-severe asthma symptoms.

Snacks of fresh fruit, simple nutritious family meals and adding a daily multi-vitamin are easy ways to help teens consume the proper amounts of essential nutrients. Improving nutrition along with good hand washing can keep you child well and in school!
