Notes from the Performing Arts

#### DHS Lab Band 1 Selected for *Swing Central* Competition and Workshop

Denton High School Lab Band 1 has been selected to participate in the sixth annual *SWING CENTRAL* High School Jazz Band Competition & Workshop, an event produced by the Savannah Music Festival that was recently dubbed the "pro bowl of high school jazz band competitions" by the *South Florida Sun Sentinel*.

Denton High School jazz students will work with jazz masters across three days, perform in showcases on Savannah's River Street, play in competition rounds, and attend a variety of Savannah Music Festival performances during their stay, which takes place from March 30 through April 1, 2011.

"This is one of the most amazing opportunities that high school jazz students can have. We are very fortunate to have competed well and make it to the final round in Savannah," remarked Denton High School Lab Band 1 director Jesse Woolery.

As part of *SWING CENTRAL*, each participating band receives a visit from a *SWING CENTRAL* clinician in February to help them prepare for the event. On March 31, all bands perform in public showcases at Rousakis Plaza on River Street. Competition rounds take place all day on April 1 at the Lucas Theatre for the Arts, and will be webcast for family and friends who aren't able to make the trip to Savannah. Each band plays three selections: "After You've Gone" arr. by Bill Holman, "Jada" by Oliver Nelson, and "Slide's Derangement" by Slide Hampton, who will be the special guest artist for *SWING CENTRAL* 2011.

The three top-scoring bands each receive an honorarium (\$5000 for first, \$2500 for second and \$1000 for third place) and perform the opening set at the SMF production *Downtown Uproar: Small Band Music of Duke Ellington*, featuring The Clayton Brothers, Marcus Roberts Trio, and all of the *SWING CENTRAL* clinicians at 7:30 p.m. that night. Other competitors receive a \$500 travel stipend.
