Another Great Day for the DHS Chess Club!

On Saturday, October 22 DHS Chess Club members participated in both the High School Open and Non-Rated sections of the Fort Worth Academy Scholastic Chess Tournament. Members competing were William Root, Austin McGregor, Luis Guevara, Alex Elizalde and Shawn Joss.

The DHS Team brought home the 1st Place Team Trophy in the High School Open section. William Root won the 1st Place Individual Trophy in the High School Open section; and Shawn Joss won the 2nd Place Individual Trophy in the Non-Rated Section



Individual student results were: William Root scoring 4.5 points out of 5; Shawn Joss scoring 4 points; Austin McGregor scoring 3 points; Luis Guevara 2 points; and Alex Elizalde 1 point. A win is worth one point and a draw is worth .5 points. The DHS Chess Club is coached by former U.S. Women's Champion Dr. Alexey Root and sponsored by Math teacher Fred Mueller.

The DHS Chess Club is available to all students regardless of prior knowledge or skill level. Students can just play for fun, learn the game; or improve their skills for tournament events.

Volunteers are also needed to help set up the book sale Tuesday-Thursday, February 28-March 1, and to clean up Monday, March 5. The set up and clean up volunteer hours are between 10am-9pm. Setup work is flexible on a come and go basis as as each volunteer's personal schedule permits. Any time you can give will help.

Book Cents is a used book sale created in 2008 by the Denton Public School Foundation (DPSF) and the Denton Community Council of PTA (DCCP) as a shared event to benefit both organizations. The goal of the book sale is to promote education through reading and recycling.

The DPSF portion of the proceeds goes toward library initiatives at Denton ISD's existing and new campuses. Denton Community Council of PTA uses its half of the proceeds to help with startup funds for new school's PTA, ongoing training for all PTA chapters in the district, PTA Summer Leadership Conference scholarships, and College Scholarships to DISD students.

Bronco Salsa Is Back!






2012 Grad Night

The Grad Night Committee is in the planning stages of DHS Grad Night 2012. Grad Night has been a very successful project for many years at Denton High School thanks to the generous support of people like you. It is sponsored primarily by the parents of graduating DHS seniors.

What is Grad Night? The idea of Grad Night is to provide a safe alcohol and drug-free graduation event for only DHS graduating seniors after the graduation ceremony on June 1, 2012. It supports a positive approach to our teens' "rite of passage" from high school.

Grad Night is a lock-in event that will keep the grads busy all night with activities including dancing, sports, games, auctions, drawings, and food. Graduates will have multiple opportunities to win Bronco Bucks that can be used to bid on prizes. (Bronco Bucks have no cash value and can only be used during Grad Night.) Prizes in years past have included items that range from flat screen TVs, telephones and mini refrigerators to microwaves, gift cards, cash prizes and much more.

Tickets are \$20 if purchased by April 1, 2012 and \$25 if purchased after April 1, 2012. Tickets purchased by April 1, 2012 include a \$500 Broncos Bucks bonus to be used at the event.

Grad Night 2012 will be held at Dave & Buster's in Frisco, which is an indoor facility. Because of the distance and liability, all students **must** ride school buses to and from the event.

Mr. Darrell Muncy has committed to provide the buses.

It costs a lot to provide the facility, food, games and prizes for Grad Night. Ticket sales cover only a fraction of the cost. We hope to provide our graduates with an event as successful as those held in previous years. The Grad Night Committee must raise all funds used to pay for this event.

We have received some donations from previous Grad Nights and the Denton Public School Foundation. Hopefully, we will receive additional support from businesses, families and individuals in our community.

The DHS Grad Night Committee will recognize each contributor in the Denton Record-Chronicle and in a letter to the graduate's family. Recognition is based on the level of giving: Bronco - \$500 & above; Purple - \$250 - \$499; Gold \$100 - \$249; White – less than \$100.

May we count on your support for this year's DHS senior class? You can help by volunteering on one of the committees as well as by donating either money or items that the kids can use in college, vocational training, or on their first jobs. Your time, contribution and pledge will help us immensely with the planning and success of Grad Night 2012.
